## Disco Fever -- The Untold Story

*In 1975, America was on the skids. Drastic steps had to be taken before the Bicentennial celebration in 1976.*

**MAURICE:** ... Old and young, black and white, gay and straight, conservative and liberal, boys and girls ...

**ALAN ALDA:** That's "women".

**SENATOR TED KENNEDY:** That's easy, Gerry. I have a good friend in New York City who owns a club on 54th Street. He knows all the beautiful people -- Bianca, Warhol, Jelly Bean, Halston, Liza, Shep, Jackie O. Boy, they've shown me some great times there --the food, the booze, the girls...
