THE '70s PRESERVATION SOCIETY¹⁴

The '70s Preservation Society is thrilled that so many historians are finally coming to the conclusion that the 1970s was the greatest decade of the 20th century. And why not? It seems like only yesterday when phony '50s nostalgia bored us to tears. Haven't we seen enough footage of hippies celebrating the counterculture at Woodstock? The '60s are dead. The '80s revival is light years away. Now it is our time. Time to bring back the '70s. And you can bet your beanbag chair that the '70s Preservation Society will be there for the entire journey.
